

Established in 2013, Advenio eAcademy is a Further & Higher Education Institution (FHI) based in Malta, (MFHEA Licence number: 2013-FHI-006) which caters for an international clientele of discerning educational service providers and learners. It was the first higher educational institution (HEI) in Malta licensed by the National Commission for Further and Higher Education in Malta, MFHEA, to provide on-line certified courses.

The e-learning platform used by Advenio eAcademy is the award winning EB-Learn solution developed and maintained by E-Business Systems, the web solutions arm of AllSecure Ltd. eB-Learn provides, audio-visual and video presentations, forum and wiki capabilities, and integrates video conferencing facilities to allow for one-to-one or one- to-many coaching or tutorial sessions. It also allows for linking of third party on-line libraries and other additional resources.

The eB-Learn platform provides a virtual campus which allows for the development and deployment of state-of-the-art educational and training programmes that really add value to the students and the stakeholders.

Critical to the success of Advenio eAcademy is the student-centric approach adopted in all its operations. It is driven by a team of professionals determined to harness technology and partner networks to develop and deliver top quality programmes cost and time effectively, ensuring added value to students. Since its inception Advenio eAcademy has had a track record of international collaboration to seek best practices in elearning.

In 2013 it commenced with a series of short courses at Level 5 in Romania with the University of Bucharest as well as running these programmes in Malta in collaboration with the Malta Institute

of Management. 2014 Advenio eAcademy established collaboration in Serbia through collaboration agreements for 5 elearning Level short courses with the University of Nis and the University of Novi Sad. These short course courses in Principles Management and

Principles of Marketing & Sales were delivered in the English Language and proved to be very useful for technical graduates who had no formal training in these fields and were seeking employment with international companies with operations in Serbia.

This programme was extended in 2017 to Hungary through a collaboration agreement for provision of short courses at Level 5 with Szent Istvan University. Late in 2015 Advenio eAcademy commenced its research for the development of a masters programme in Enterpreneurship and discussions were held with the partner organisations it already had collaboration agreements with.

In the past couple of years, Advenio eAcademy has established strategic collaborations and partnerships with key stakeholders such as Malta Communications Authority, Malta Institute for Professional Photographers, SOS Malta and TradeMalta in developing and delivering high quality online education.

Advenio eAcademy continues to seek local and international partnerships for collaboration with higher educational institutes and commercial partners that seek to exploit and leverage the power of elearning to add value to the various adult student groups.

In recent years, Advenio eAcademy has developed a network of recruitment agencies and consultancies in various regions and countries to assist in the recruitment of foreign students for its blended learning programmes in Malta.

Erasmus+ Involvement

Advenio eAcademy launched its accredited online programmes in 2013 as part of its vision for improved remote learning to entrepreneurs and SMEs EU through elearning. This vision included a very open international perspective to online education. It called for sourcing of faculty internationally though collaboration agreements with various European universities and academics, and for the sourcing of students internationally. By 2016, the need to form part of a larger EU framework was recognised and an application was filed for membership of the Erasmus+ Charter. In 2017, Advenio eAcademy became a member for the Charter and started to participate in Erasmus+ programmes. Since then it has been project leader on four Erasmus+ projects involving partners from Cyprus, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Lithuania, Slovakia, Turkey, and Ukraine.



MFHEA Accreditation & Certification

The accredited programmes provided by Advenio eAcademy are deemed by the Malta Further & Higher Education Authority (MFHEA) to be equivalent to the Malta Qualifications Framework under the European Qualifications Framework. This accreditation confirms the quality assurance and recognition of programmes within the EU.

The Malta Qualifications Framework (MQF) assists in making the Maltese qualifications system easier to understand and review, and more transparent at a national and international level. This is also a referencing tool that helps to describe and compare both national and foreign qualifications to promote quality, transparency and mobility of qualifications in all types of education.

It is mainly referenced to the European Qualifications Framework (EQF) as well as to other non-European qualifications frameworks. The reference levels make it easier to understand what a learner with a qualification related to the Malta Qualifications Framework knows, understands and is able to do.

MFHEA acts as a broker between the government and relevant Higher Education Institutions and has successfully established a structured dialogue, through a series of regular consultations with all stakeholders to take on suggestions, recommendations and address concerns for the sector. These would serve as input towards the development of national strategies.

ECTS credits act as a quality assurance policy which establishes a point of reference for recognition and esteem. The recognition of credits enables learners to obtain recognition of the learning outcomes achieved in different countries without the need of re-assessment.

ECTS is a credit system based on the learning achievements and workload of a course, students can transfer their ECTS credits from one university to another so they are added up to contribute to an individual's degree programme or training. Therefore upon presentation of the accredited certificate, employers will have a clearer picture of the student's achievements within the national and European framework of qualifications.

E-Learning Platform – eB-Learn

Since 2003, E-Business Systems in Malta has been working on the development and enhancement of its e-learning platform, EBLearn. This platform provides a very user-friendly approach to blended learning. It allows for the seamless integration of the traditional classroom environments with the more modern online variations. eBLearn offers flexibility for student enrolment, which is particularly attractive for inhouse learning environments. In this way students can enrol per programme, which would comprise a number of courses each with a number of modules in each course. Or they could choose to enrol for an individual course within a programme, or they could also choose to enrol for specific modules within individual courses of a programme.

EBLearn was the winner of the Malta Communications Authority national e-Biz Award 2011 for Best Use of Technology in Education and Training. EBLearn is different to most e-learning applications on the market, since it is highly customisable and includes extensive facilities for self-learning or group learning within the system, which can be set to best fit the learning style and learning methodology of the particular institution.

A core functionality of the eB-Learn platform is that is caters for both self-learning (asynchronous learning) and collaborative learning (synchronous) learning. In the former approach the learning objects can be followed independently by the user with little or no support from the Faculty.

The synchronous elements require collaboration and interaction with other participants and the Faculty, typically involving scheduled engagements.

EBLearn is a turn–key solution to organisations that seek state-of-the-art solutions to enhance the learning experience of their participants. EBLearn is offered on a software-as-a-solution (SaaS) basis, which means that clients do not have to invest in hardware or in technical support teams to run the system. This ensures a tighter control on spend and a more cost efficient use of resources.

• The system allows flexibility in the design and development of content material for traditional classroom based courses, for blended learning courses (including a mix of on-line interactive or pre-recorded audio visual classes and traditional classroom classes)

or for on-line courses (which include only document and audio visual material that is available on-line).

- Flexibility in the operation of the system as it is provided on a SaaS basis allowing for quick scalability and strong business continuity and disaster recovery back-up solutions.
- Flexibility in the management of the programmes with powerful course management tools available to administrators to enable them to use EBLearn system data to act proactively to improve overall student course participation and completion rates.

EBLearn supports collaborative learning, online tutoring/mentoring, virtual assistance, online assessment and intelligent document handling. The EBLearn platform differs from most e-learning applications on the market, since it is highly customisable and includes extensive facilities for self-learning or group learning within the system. These can be set to best fit the learning style and learning methodology of the particular institution.



Internal Quality Assurance

The conceptual approach to quality is the recommended quality cycle referred to as a Quality Spiral where the objective is that for every cycle the various courses are stepped up in terms of quality.

The Internal Quality Asssurance is built upon the Open ECBCheck Framework. Open ECBCheck is a quality improvement scheme for E-Learning programmes. It supports organisations to measure how successful their e-learning programmes are and allows for continuous improvement though peer collaboration and bench learning. Open

2016 Advenio eAcademy led the formation of a consortium of European HEIs to focus on the development and implementation of best practices in graduate elearning and set-up of a framework for the development of an online Master's degree in Entrepreneurship. The initial work of this consortium led to the development of a proposal for Erasmus+ co-funding being submitted. Although the bid was positively received, it was not selected for funding in 2016. Further development was made on the bid an additional partner HEIs brought in for the bid to be re-submitted with various changes in 2017. This Level 7 programme is awarded by AeA in collaboration with partner HEIs from Greece (University of Ioannina), Hungary (Szent Istvan University), Italy (University of Bari Aldo Moro),

Slovakia (university of Zilina) and Ukraine (Poltava University of Economics and Trade). The first intake commenced in April 2018 as an Erasmus+co-funded project. SMEs. The programme was in response to the market requirements for specialised

post graduate quality courses that meet the needs of existing entrepreneurs and small business managers. The focus of this programme is to provide entrepreneurs, or aspiring entrepreneurs, with a higher level of competence to enable them to successfully launch or grow their SME operation. The consortium developed the programme in 4 different stages:

Stage 1 – 5 Foundation modules

Stage 2 – 4 Specialist Modules;

Stage 3 – Internship

Stage 4 – Investor ready Business Plan Project.

The project reached its objectives as it was successfully accredited by the Malta education regulator, then known as the National Commission for Further and Higher Education NCFHE, now known as the Malta Further & Higher Education Authority, MFHEA. One of the key achievements of this project was the cooperation to develop and implement a Masters programme with a network of six Higher Education Institutes, each having different expertise within the Entrepreneurship field. This way the students had the opportunity to interact and learn from leading experts from an international faculty.

In addition, the student group also created a mix of nationalities and encouraged debates and cross-cultural interaction between the faculty and the students, with nine different nationalities being represented. A total number of 15 students enrolled for the full programme. In total 12 students graduated, 2 with an Award in Entrepreneurship, 2 with a Post-Graduate Certificate in Entrepreneurship and 8 with a Masters in Entrepreneurship.

This project was very successfull and positive feed-back was received by the students. The national agency, EUPA, also had positive feedback on how the project was managed and Advenio eAcademy was presented with a certificate for good practice for the MHEI-ME Masters in Entrepreneurship programme.

This project, Accreditation & Recognition of Prior Experience & Learning for Entrepreneurship (AR-PEL4Entrep) was launched in September 2020 as an Erasmus+ co-funded project developed by a group of European Higher Educational Institutions and Technical Partners. The scope of the project is to leverage the infrastructure and competencies of the partners in e-learning and the collective expertise and resources of the partners in creating a programme which would encourage entrepreneurs to accredit and recognise their prior experience and learning as part of an online Bachelor's Degree in Entrepreneurship.

This project is based on providing a framework for recognition of prior learning to enable seasoned entrepreneurs to continue with their studies: - Accreditation & Recognition of Prior & Experiential Learning (ARPEL) is the process where credit is sought for learning which has not previously been

assessed and formally accredited. This programme is based on EQF standards and the use of ECTS credits. It is learning which has taken place through a range of personal experiences often including unstructured informal and formal learning experiences. In many fields, the skills, knowledge and abilities that are acquired through this type of learning can be just as relevant as those gained by students following formal accredited educational programmes.

A major innovation of this programme is the EQF/MQF accreditation which ensures the quality of the programme and enables graduates to get automatic recognition of their qualifications throughout the EU and other countries which are signatories to the Bologna Process which establishes the validity of the EQF ECTS accreditation system. The Erasmus+ARPEL Project includes:- research on market needs and course content; design, development and production of course content, customization of online evaluation engine, accreditation of programme, implementation of pilot programme and dissemination of project results.

The programme comprises three Stages:- Stage #1: ARPEL Component valid for up to 90ECTS credits at Level 6; Stage #2: 8 Subject Modules x 8 ECTS credits; valid for 64 ECTS credits; Stage #3: Research Project x 26 ECTS credits. Intake 1 commenced in October 2021 with the Stage #1 ARPEL Process, with Stage #2 commenced in January 2022 and Stage #3 scheduled to commence in Feb 2023 with completion by July 2023.

Award in NGO Management

The Award in NGO Management is an online accredited programme designed to assist Voluntary Organisation officers and staff in meeting the challenges of managing a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO). It seeks to provide in a concise format the knowledge and know how to assist them in strengthening their skills and competences. This programme will enable NGOs to upskill and develop their management capacity, to increase their social impact, achieve their goals, and be sustainable over time.

NGOs and NGO members all need some sort of training to be able to effectively implement the mission that their respective NGO is working towards. This programme will provide them and other potential new students with the opportunity to improve their skills, knowledge and competences and the capacity of their NGO whilst, getting an accredited certificate at EQF Level 5 with 10 ECTS credits. This award will be recognised through-out the EU and all signatories to the Bologna Process. The partners are targeting to at least recruit students from two EU countries, Malta and Cyprus. This will benefit the students as they will be able to network with other NGO members who operate locally but also in other EU countries.

This project includes a Higher Education Institute from Malta as the lead applicant and two NGOs from Malta and Cyprus. Thus, the HEI partner and NGOs are looking at this project to cater for different needs. Particularly, the HEI partner want to increase their programmes library to be in a position to offer a specific programme to this target market. Whilst the NGOs will also seek to increase their own capacity by encouraging their own employees to enrol in the pilot intake/s and thus improve their skills, knowledge and competences.

As at 22nrd April 2022 Intake 1 of the programme was being implemented with 26 students from Malta and Cyprus.

The SocEntrep Erasmus+ co-funded project was launched in November 2021 to address the identified lack of research specifically to determine the challenges and the training needs by current and new social entrepreneurs. The project comprises three stages —

- (i) research & development of social entrepreneurial activity in the partner countries;
- (ii) design, development and production of accredited online educational programme in social entrepreneurship;
- (iii) implementation of pilot accredited online programme and feedback.

This project's scope seeks to improve the capacity of existing NGOs working within the third sector, current and future social entrepreneurs by providing them with a formal qualification directly related to Social Entrepreneurship. The proposed programme will be designed and developed based on the feedback that the project partners will receive from the participants in the research study to be carried out in this project. The project seeks to achieve the following objectives:-

1. Research current best practices in Social Entrepreneurship (SE) and SE programmes required to support NGOs. This will help in understanding the particular challenges met by current and future social entrepreneurs, employees working in NGOs and NGO volunteers.

Award in eCommerce Practices



In 2018 in collaboration with the Malta Communications Authority, Advenio eAcademy launched the Award in eCommerce Practices a Level 4 programme to encourage the take-up of ICT studies. The Malta Communications Authority was set up to regulate communications services, which include, fixed and mobile telephony, Internet and TV distribution services, the postal sector, eCommerce services and Malta's radio spectrum resources.

Under the banner eBiznify, this initiative of MCA in collaboration with Advenio eAcademy is part-financed by the Operational Programme II of the European Structural and Investment funds 20- 14-2020. eBiznify will provide state-of-the-art customised learning solutions to the Maltese market through a certified 4 ECTS credit Level 4 Course in eCommerce. It includes both self-learning and collaborative learning elements and will require participants to participate in various on-line and on-site workshop/tutorial sessions. In addition, they will also be required to participate in online forum discussions and to work on various assignment projects during the twelve week course. All of these elements are integral to the on-going evaluation process key to the certification of the programme by MFHEA. In 2020, the programme has been revised to add additional weight on the students time involved in carrying out the assessment elements and therefore, each module is now accredited with 1 ECTS credits.

- 2. Design and develop the proposed Social Entrepreneurship programme set for the level recommended by the research and including specialist content also confirmed through the research.
- 3. Accreditation by the national regulator in Malta, Malta Further & Higher Education Authority (MFHEA) of the new social entrepreneurship online programme. Accreditation ensures that students completing the programme earn a qualification that is recognised within the EU and within those countries that are signatories to the Bologna process.
- 4. Marketing of the new Social Entrepreneurship programme to recruit suitable social entrepreneurs for participation in the pilot programme Intake #1. An online campaign will be run in each of the four partner countries to promote the programme and recruit students.
- 5. Implement the 18-month online Social Entrepreneurship programme as a pilot programme and evaluate its effectiveness. Based on the Erasmus+ funding, circa 60 students will be offered a full scholarship in the programme.

Principles & Best Practices of Photography



In 2019, Advenio eAcademy and the Malta Institute of Professional Photographers (MIPP) entered into a strategic collaboration agreement for the provision of quality online and blended learning programmes in photography and

videography. This collaboration will enable the MIPP to supplement its current range of on-site courses in photography for the local community of photography enthusiasts. This collaboration enables MIPP to provide a wider range of courses in photography and videography which can also be followed by an international audience.

The online programmes in photography are to be developed in collaboration with Advenio eAcademy and would be supplemented with a series of onsite week-end Master Class workshop/tutorial sessions. This project fitted in nicely with Advenio eAcademy's goal of providing top quality online courses in Entrepreneurship and related matters to aspiring and established entrepreneurs.

The first online photography course was developed in Q4 2019 and was launched in Q1 2020. The programme was launched as a self learning programme without any formal evaluation and coursework obligations normally required for accreditation.

Award in Gender Based Violence Support for HR Professionals



Violet Support Online is part of the GBVSO project, a partnership between Solidarity and Overseas Service Malta (SOS Malta), Victim Support Malta, CORE platform, Commission on Domestic Violence (CDV) and Advenio eAcademy as

the training Partner.

As a project, GB-VSO aims to tackle the above issues and provide protection and support for Victims of Gender Based Violence. It follows the premise that providing comprehensive support structures, increasing the capacity to respond, together with awareness-raising will contribute to ensuring that

victims understand their situation, and feel empowered and supported to speak out. This project will specifically look at the workplace as a place where support structures could be strengthened.

'The Award in Gender-Based Violence Support for HR Professionals' is an online accredited programme by the National Commission for Further and Higher Education, with 2 ECTS credits at EQF/MQF Level 5.

This award includes various guests from the field of gender-based violence and human resources who impart their specialized knowledge and talk about their practical experiences.

Successful completion of ten of the micro-credential courses entitles the participant to the 10 ECTS credit Award in SME Management (CPD). The programme is delivered on a part-time basis typically requiring one week (up to four weeks) to complete each micro-credential course.

Following the successful launch of the programme in 2021, Advenio eAcademy as the awarding body, in collaboration with University of Bari, Aldo Moro, Italy; University of Ioannina, Greece; Vilnius University, Lithuania; and University of



Study in Malta

Situated at the middle of the Mediterranean, the Maltese Islands have long been considered as the lifeline between Africa and Europe. This has led to the Islands being ruled by a succession of sovereigns, leaving their imprints on many facets of Maltese culture, ranging from the warm and welcoming character of the Maltese people to the entrepreneurial spirit of the Maltese businessperson.

Malta is a small island but smallness has its advantages. The small geographic size makes it relatively cheap, quick and easy to get around the island, especially with the many direct bus routes to and from various bus termini. Malta's proximity to other Schengen and EU countries and the numerous direct flight connections make it very easy to explore the Mediterranean region.

Malta enjoys a temperate climate with mild winters and warm summers. With a Mediterranean climate similar to that of southern Italy or Greece, the weather in Malta is one reason for the country's popularity with tourists. During summer, daytime temperatures are typically above 30°C (86°F) and in winter not usually lower than 15°C (59°F).

Malta may be small, but it's also packed with things to see and do. The country's thriving tourism industry has spurred on the development of its lively nightlife and cultural scenes, as well as a wide range of outdoor activities, from tennis and golf to paragliding and diving.


With Mediterranean characteristics, Maltese food is similar to that of neighbouring island Sicily. Fresh fruit, vegetables, pasta and seafood are all key elements. Traditional dishes include rabbit stew, fish pie, bragioli (stuffed beef), and bigilla (a thick bean dip). Popular for snacking are pastizzi (savoury pastries) and ħobż biż-żejt (traditional bread with olive oil, tomatoes and a mix of other toppings). There are also lots of restaurants specializing in cuisines from around the world from Italian, British, Indian, Chinese and Arabic.

Options for accommodation in Malta include private apartment rental or staying with a local host family.

Students from within the EU, the US and a number of other countries do not require a visa to study in Malta for less than three months. If students plan to stay for longer, check with your nearest Maltese embassy or consulate to find out whether you need a visa. If you do, the visa requirements for Malta ask you to provide:

- Completed visa application form
- Valid travel document (passport)
- Two passport-size photographs
- A valid return ticket or certificate of prepaid return journey
- Proof of access to sufficient funds to cover tuition fees and living expenses
- Letter of acceptance from a Maltese educational institute
- Proof of accommodation arrangements on arrival
- Proof of medical insurance for duration of your stay

All international students planning to study in Malta for more than three months must apply for an e-residence document, which is replacing the old identity card system. This requires many of the same documents and supporting materials listed above, and can be applied for after arrival in the country.



On-site Support Services

The dramatic COVID-19 pandemic which struck in 2020 has impacted travel arrangements between different countries for years to come. Malta has taken a very disciplined approach to combatting this pandemic. Travel restrictions were lifted for flights to and from a number of countries as from July 2020. On the basis of current guidelines by the relevant authorities, Advenio eAcademy plans to host students in Malta for the blended learning programmes as from October 2020. Advenio eAcademy's tuition centre is located within the Easy School of Language Centre in Valletta. On-site classes are held at the Centre in Malta. Applications for the blended learning programmes will be processed accordingly and the relevant offers of place issued would be for the blended learning programmes in Malta with the proviso that the students may commence their studies online should there be any travel restrictions in place to prevent the student attending classes in Malta.

The on-site support classes component is delivered at Advenio eAcademy's on-site location in Valletta, Malta. This is an accredited educational centre located within the popular Easy School of Language.
